MILITARY CALLED OUT IN LONDON

London, July 17.—For the first time since the dockers' strike began nine weeks ago, troops were called out today to preserve peace. The order, which sent several companies of the Irish guards into the disturbed district, followed a report that the strikers, many thousands of whom, with their families, are on the verge of starvation in the East end of London, were approaching the point of desperation. The authorities were advised of threatened bloody reprisals on the non-unionist workmen, who have taken the places of the strikers.

LONG LIST OF FATALITIES IN MONTREAL

Montreal, July 16.—The bodies of six men were brought to the morgue here between Saturday night and this morning. They are those of Arthur LeGrange, carpenter, died from heat; James Windsor, painter, died from heat; Marisse Cusson, moulder, died from heat; E. Jodoin, killed by street car; Nicholair Cronichin, killed by machinery at Angus shops of C. P. R. falling on him, and Andrew Aird, longshoreman, drowned while bathing.
