> them. "We emphasize Mr. Massingham's saying that the farmer must be included. It is by the uniting of the farmer and the laborer that success can be achieved. Any policy that lays additional burdens on the farmer without relieving or assisting him is bound to fail.

"We believe that the limitation of the power of the landlord in towns is as important as it is in the country. In a word, the land problem, as Mr. Massingham says, must include all masses of workers, must be based on the transference of the burden of local taxation, and must inaugurate a great policy of compulsory purchase on the capital value and of compulsory building.

"We may predict without much fear of error that by autumn the solution of the main problem will be reached, and the chief lines of the new program settled."
