ASQUITH ON HOME RULE IS ELOQUENT

London, July 23—Premier Asquith in a speech at Thornton-hough, Cheshire, on Saturday, said, "When the country after a truce of twelve months caused by the death of King Edward declared itself in favor of a parliament bill it was with knowledge that the measure would be used first to arry Home Rule for Ireland, religious equality in Wales and simplification of the franchise."
