PRINCE RUPERT COAL FIELDS

A company under the name of the Prince Rupert Coal Fields, Ltd., of which F. M. Dockrill of Vancouver is managing director, holds 28,000 acres of coal lands on the headwaters of Morice and Telkwa Rivers, tributary to Aldermere. The company is incorporated with a capital of \$5,000,000 in share of \$100. Its locations are 35 miles distant from the main line of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway. During the past two years the company had two drills at work testing their ground. They have so far proved only four workable seams of coal of the following dimensions: No. 1, 4 feet thick; No. 2, 5 feet thick; No. 3, 6 feet 2 inches thick; No. 4, 7 feet thick, and Mr. Dockrill estimates the work so far done establishes a probable supply of 70,000,000 tons of coal. They have six weeks' more drilling to do to complete their plans. The next move will be to open up a coal mine. The railway will not reach Aldermere till next fall, however, and they can do nothing toward getting in machinery till the railway is available to that point. The company have now done development work on their ground every summer for the past five years.

The coal is bituminous, and analyses show about 60 per cent. of fixed carbon. The seven foot seam is a good coking coal. There are about twelve seams of coal on the ground, but those itemized are the only ones of workable extent, the others being only from one to two feet thick. The coal is clean. Analyses show the ash to run from 6 per cent. to 9 per cent.

The capital of the company, says the B. C. Mining Record, has been privately subscribed, and the stock is mainly held in New York. The property was examined and reported on by H. L. Hawkins.
