CITIZENS BRIGADES FORMED IN NORTHERN CHINA FOR DEFENCE OF CITIES AGAINST BRIGAND BANDS



Honanfu, China, July 31—Despite the vigorous military campaign the Republican government has been waging for weeks to restore order in Northwestern China, outlawry has been gaining rather than losing ground lately.

At present, in fact, regularly organized robber bands are in practically complete control of most of the country, nearly as far south and east as Honanfu. For that matter there are violent disorders in Mongolia and Tibet, too, with the merely nominal difference that the outlaws in the two dependencies pretend to be fighting for independence from Chinese rule, whereas those in China "proper" admit out and

out that they are nothing but robbers.

The scale on which the banditti are conducting operations are so large, however, as almost to give it an air of respectability. Roughly, their sphere of influence includes all of Kansu and Shensi provinces, the northeastern corner of Honan, and the western half of Shansi, almost up to the western gates of Tai Yuanfu, the provincial capital, which is connected by wire and rail with Peking—a field altogether of almost 100,000 square miles. The robbers are divided into a considerable number of separate gangs, which occasionally clash with one another, but generally get on fairly well together, respecting each other's

territory, and to some extent co-operating in matters of common concern, under the implied terms of a kind of loose federation of interest.

All except the most important towns have given up resisting the outlaws and pay regular tribute to them in return from exemption from attack. Occasionally one of them undertakes to repudiate its allegiance to the chieftain who claims jurisdiction over it, and a very few have proved strong enough to keep the robbers at a distance, but the majority have been promptly reduced to subjection and compelled to pay heavy penalties and a few have been looted and burned and many of their inhabitants massacred.

The London correspondent of the New York Post cabled:

The congestion of securities continues. Some recent borrowers, notably Newfoundland and the city of Edmonton, had to increase the underwriting commission from 1 to 1 1/2 per cent. in order to induce the market to guarantee the issues. Such a policy cannot long continue, as the knowledge that such high terms are offered will restrain the public from subscribing, investors knowing full well that they will be able to buy securities at a discount later on.—Montreal Financial Times.
