NAVY SPEECHES A LANDMARK IN THE HISTORY OF THE WORLD

Earl Selborne Makes Enthusiastic Reference to Asquith's and Churchill's Speeches About Empire's Future Co-Operation France Secured By the British Alliance

London, Aug. 1.—Lord Selborne, speaking in the House of Lords about Asquith and Churchill's naval speeches, said: "I've no hesitation in saying that their utterances concerning the Dominions form a landmark in the history of the world. I don't for a moment grudge that it has fallen to the lot of political opponents to be in office when the time came to say those words, because they are sentiments in which we share to the full. There is nothing we would rejoice in more than to have the whole question of imperial unity removed from party politics, as we hope the question of the navy may be."

Apropos of the French visit of the Canadian Ministers, the Mail declares that anything tending to improve relations between Canada and France is a gain to the Empire. The visit will emphasize the fact that Britain and France long since ceased to be divided. French-Canadians must see that in strengthening the defences of the Empire they are also pledging France's security. —Toronto Star.

WOMEN ARE NOT SUITED FOR PLACES REQUIRING CALMNESS

CORONER SAYS THEY LACK COOL JUDGMENT IN TIMES OF DANGER—ALSO FORTITUDE AND ENDURANCE—ONE WOMAN OPERATOR CAUSED A WRECK

Chicago, Aug. 2.—Coroner P. Hoffman, of Cook County admitted that he attempted to influence his jury to insert more criticism of railroads employing women in important signal tower positions in the verdict returned on the death of thirteen victims of the Burlington wreck at Western Springs on July 4. The jury recommended that only men be employed as tower operators.

Today Coroner Hoffman went further and said: "Women are weaker physically than men. They lack a certainty of understanding. They lack fortitude and endurance. The female mind is not habituated to cool judgment in times of danger. I like to see women advance, but they have no business in positions like this."

Even Men Blow Up

New York, Aug. 1—"If all men were condemned because of one man's mistake in a crisis all you men would be out of jobs."

This was the comment of Miss Caroline Lexow, secretary of the Women's Political Union, today, on the recommendation of a Chicago coroner's jury that only men be employed as tower operators, following the fatal Burlington wreck attributed to a tower woman's mistake.

"Of course, this poor woman went 'up in the air'—then this terrible crisis," continued Miss Lexow. "But don't men 'blow up,' too?"
