One of the scows brought up by the Chieftain this trip carries the largest shipment yet received on any one scow by the local company, being well near the half million mark.

RUPERT HAS PROGRAMME FOR THE DUKE

In order to comply with a request from the Governor General's military secretary for a copy of the proposed programme of events during His Royal Highness' visit to Prince Rupert this coming September, a rough draft of the programme that had been drawn up was before the City Council last evening. This included presentation of addresses by the Mayor and other public bodies, a luncheon by the Canadian Club to the Duke and a reception by the Daughters of the Empire to the Duchess and Princess Patricia, a concert in the Westholme Opera House by the ladies of the woman's Auxiliary of the General Hospital, placing of the corner stone for the new wing of the hospital by the Duke, and planting of a tree by Princess Patricia in the new city park, together with a trip up the line of the G. T. P., ball, Indian band concerts and numerous other events if they can be crowded in. A motion was passed approving the schedule of events with power to revise before being finally adopted.
