COAL MINERS BELIEVE THEY KEEP THE KEYS OF WAR FOR THE WHOLE WORLD TODAY

It is only natural to expect that there would be debates of exceptional interest at the 23rd International Congress of Miners which has just concluded its labors at Amsterdam, and at which 1,159,000 organized miners were represented. The contrary was the case. That which weighed heaviest on the minds of the delegates was just that about which the least was said.

Maintain Peace

The first political aim on which unanimity prevails is the maintenance of peace. To stop the coal supply is to stop war. This was said more than once, and the miners are confident they hold the key of the situation. But there are laws, especially in Germany, which allow trade union meetings and organizations; but, if politics are introduced, then these laws no longer apply. The British and French delegates had proposed to discuss the possibilities of preventing war by an international strike. This might, however, involve some of the delegates present in legal difficulties.

Miners Will Watch

The committee therefore decided that a statement from the chair should be made but with-

out submitting a resolution. Mr. Smillie, as Vice-President of the British Federation of Miners, explained the position. If, he remarked, arbitration was preferable to a strike, it was still more needed as a substitute for war. The Miners' International Committee would make it their duty to watch the chiefs of States, the financiers, and the newspapers. If at any time they appeared likely to succeed in bringing about war, a special International Congress of Miners would be convoked to see what action they could take to prevent the outbreak of hostilities.

SUPERB WHEAT ON EXHIBITION IN OCTOBER

Lethbridge, Alta., August 7.—One of the largest stools of wheat ever exhibited has been received at the International Dry Farming Congress office from D. E. Harris of Cardston, Alberta, having 195 spikes. This enormous number of spikes is thought

to establish a new world's record, for Dondlinger, a wheat authority, says that in the observations of experts only as many as 52 spikes have been observed in a single stool. There are other authorities, however, who credit the finding of 95 as possible, while Humboldt believed 70, which was found in a stool in Mexico was the limit. Pliny, in his works, recounted reports of the finding of as many as 200 in Northern Africa and Italy, but Dondlinger, in commenting thereon, says it is probable he "was seeing with the eyes of an enthusiast."

This stool of wheat was pulled on July 1st from a field that was seeded on August 1st, 1914, and the whole field is the admiration of the farmers about Cardston. When this sample was pulled the wheat was fully 45 inches in height on the average.

This stool of wheat, and many others sent to the International Dry Farming Congress that merit it, will be used in the decorative work of the exposition next October.

REMARKABLY FINE SAMPLE OF DRY FARM OATS

Lethbridge, Alta., Aug. 7.—One of the finest samples of oats seen this season was brought in a few days ago by L. P. Tuff, who lives three miles west of Diamond City, S. E. 4-10-22, being 54 inches tall and well headed out. Mr. Tuff has turned his sample over to the International Dry Farming Congress for decorative work, and it will be given a conspicuous place in the exposition next October. He has 70 acres of these oats, which are of the Abundance variety. They grew on summer fallow, seeded on May 17th, and he used only two bushels of seed to the acre. It is a wonderful field throughout, even in height, and the crop will run far ahead of 100 bushels to the acre.
