

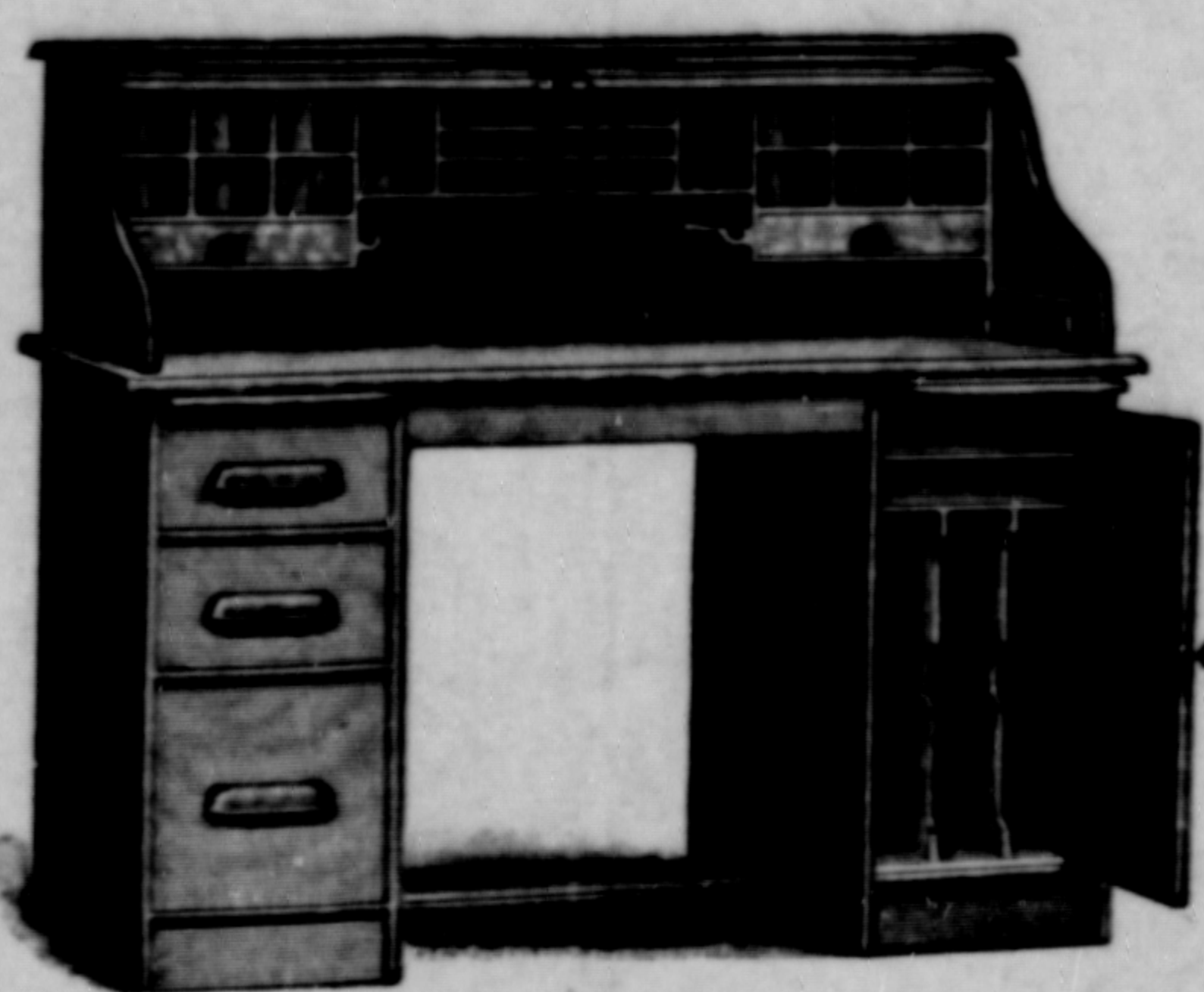

McCoy remains at liberty under \$15,000 bail.

Chicago, Aug. 22.—Jack Johnson, retired—perhaps—champion of the world, today declared he expected to receive an offer from a New York fight club for a ten round battle with Joe Jeanette, to be staged the latter part of this month.

"I expect to sign up for a go with Joe today or tomorrow," said the black champion. "I have decided to fight this battle for my wife's sake. When I told her I had retired from the ring she was much chagrined, and persuaded me to enter just one more mill. I'll start training as soon as I sign the articles."

Johnson weighs 247 pounds, just three pounds less than when he started to train for his fight with Jim Flynn at Las Vegas.
