HEAD TAX RETALIATION ON AMERICA

London, Aug. 23.—"An Englishman in Winnipeg" suggests to the Daily Express that one form of retaliation open to the old country for the Panama tolls is to impose a head tax as well as tonnage dues on all arrivals from all United States ports, and points out that the effect of this would be to divert a good deal of Atlantic traffic to Canadian routes and benefit Canadian ports.

BIG FUR CATCH IN THE NORTH

Edmonton, Alta., Aug. 23.—With last winter's catch of fur from the Chipewyan country, Colin Fraser has arrived in the city, accompanied by fifteen residents of the northland who see civilization only once a year. The fur catch of 1912 is an improvement over last year's and amounts to between \$30,000 and \$35,000. It includes many valuable skins of black and silver foxes, wolves, wolverine, mink, marten and ermine.

Railway Construction Work Starts in Town

Contractor Hardie, who has the clearing of the right-of-way for one hundred miles west of the bridge across the Fraser River at Fort George, has begun several contracts, one of which is through the Indian Reserve and the town of Fort George on the Nechako river.

LABOR GETS MORE DEADLY

Ottawa, Aug. 23.—During the month of July there were 408 fatal accidents and 207 non-fatal accidents to workmen recorded by the Department of Labor. This is an increase of 46 fatal and 23 non-fatal accidents compared with the record for June and an increase of ten fatal and 73 non-fatal accidents compared with July 1911.

YOUNG HUSBAND HEROIC

Stockton, Cal., Aug. 23.—Taking his bride two months in his arms, Harry Perry, of Tulare, hurled her to safety just as a Southern Pacific train struck his automobile. Perry was instantly killed. Five other occupants of the car heard Perry's cry of warning and all were saved. The machine was demolished.

DECEMBER MARRIES APRIL

Poughkeepsie, N. Y., Aug. 23.—A romance which culminated in the marriage at Millbrook yesterday of Stephen Scutt, 75 years old, to his grandniece, Miss Alice See, 22, is interesting to the bridegroom's neighbors in Verbank, N. Y., where he is one of the wealthiest residents.

LOST BONDS IN TITANIC DISASTER

The first application for the issuance of new stock for shares lost with the Titanic has just been passed upon by the State Court, New York, on a motion by a firm of brokers for an order compelling the New York Central Railroad to issue a new certificate for 100 shares sent from London by registered mail on that steamer.

DR. MORRISON ARRIVES IN LONDON

London, Aug. 23.—Dr. George E. Morrison, the correspondent of the Times in Peking, whose appointment as political adviser to the President of the Chinese republic for five years was recently announced, arrived in London the other night.

STEAMER SINKS SMALL POWER BOAT

Victoria, Aug. 24.—Coming into the straits this morning, en route from San Francisco, the British steamer Ikalis collided with and sank the power fishing boat Dove Cap, Captain Weaver, of Seattle. The crew, consisting of two men, were rescued and landed here by a Nanaimo pilot boat this morning.

POOR TRADE ON THE GREAT LAKES NOW

Conditions have become so bad that one line of steamships has been taken off the Great Lakes and Montreal trade entirely since July 2nd. These are the boats of the Great Lakes & St. Lawrence Transportation Company. This was done only after the Wallace, Keefe and Davidson boats, of their fleet, had lost a total of 27 days waiting to unload their cargoes of grain at Montreal, at a loss of \$135 per day, a total of \$3,645.

NELSON NURSES ARE ANNOYED

Neison, Aug. 20.—Following the expulsion Tuesday night of 11 pupil nurses at the Kootenay Lake General hospital, Miss R. S. Haw, the only pupil nurse on whom the axe did not fall, quit work and declared that she will not resume her duties unless her co-workers are reinstated. Six nurses are at present carrying on the work of 17 nurses who were formerly carried by the hospital. Just what will be the outcome of the shakeup is a matter of speculation.
