CURIOSITY NEARLY COST HIM \$100

Windsor, Aug. 28.—The curiosity of R. A. Farrell, an automobile salesman, nearly cost him the price of a \$100 diamond ring the other day. Sitting on the dock near Ouellette avenue, Farrell asked Robert Pike, another auto man, to permit him to examine a diamond ring he was wearing. Pike passed the solitaire over, but as he did so it fell from Farrell's hand into the river. The water at this point is 19 feet deep and muddy, but Farrell employed a diver and recovered the diamond in an hour at a cost of \$30. During the time the diver was submerged Farrell and Pike worked the air pump.

LARGEST WARSHIP AFLOAT

Although authorities differ as to the dimensions of the recently launched British battle cruiser Queen Mary, there seems little reason to doubt that she is the largest warship afloat at the present time. Some authorities give her dimensions as follows: Length over all, 725 feet; beam, 87 feet, displacement, 29,000 tons. She will probably make over 30 knots on trial, and to do this her turbines will have to develop not far short of 100,000 horse power. The Moltke, of 23,500 tons approximate displacement, required 90,000 horse power to drive her at from 29 to 29½ knots.

GT. BRITAIN WILL SHARE IN PANAMA SHOW

London, Aug. 28.—Rumors that Great Britain might not take part in the Panama exposition on account of dissatisfaction with the canal bill were disposed of recently when the United States embassy here received official notification from the foreign office of the participation of England in the 1915 exposition. The extent of the participation is not stated, as the allotment of space for the various countries has not yet been made. The feeling here is that any disagreement over the action of the United States as to canal tolls will be amicably adjusted before the time of the exposition.

SPLENDID REPORT OF THE C. P. R.

The forthcoming annual report of the Canadian Pacific Railway will contain a map of the system, drawn on a more comprehensive scale than any of the charts heretofore issued with the annual reports. On the new map will be shown double tracks, lines over which the company has running rights and lines projected for construction, while the names of most of the smaller stations and flag stations will be eliminated entirely, so as to present a clear picture of the system and the important cities and junction points. The company will make a new stock issue.

MOOSEJAW WRESTLER WINS OUT

Moosejaw, Aug. 28.—In a fast match at the city hall tonight, Eeklund of this city won the handicap wrestling match from Monogoff, the terrible Turk, from Chicago, at the same time winning the purse of \$1,000.

NEW U. S. PARCELS POST PLAN NOW

Washington, Aug. 28.—Plans to put into operation a new parcels post system are to be discussed tomorrow at a conference between the post office officials and Senator Borne, chairman of the Senate post office committee.

MASSACRES OF CHRISTIANS CONTINUE

Cettinje, Montenegro, Aug. 28.—Further massacres of the Christians by Turkish troops on the Albanian frontier continue to be reported, but the Montenegrin government is striving to the utmost to give effect to the peaceful counsels of the representatives of European powers.

MAY SEIZE SHIP NOW IF CONTRABAND

San Francisco, Aug. 28.—The law which subjects the captain of a vessel to fine when contraband goods are found on his ship is to be amended so that vessels will be liable for any penalty imposed and the ship will be subject to seizure in default of payment. The change in the law will be sought as the outcome of a long fight against the opium traffic by the Federal authorities.

NOTICE

Public notice is hereby given that under the first part of Chapter 79 of the Revised Statutes of Canada, 1906 known as "The Companies Act," letters patent have been issued under the seal of the Secretary of State of Canada, bearing date the 18th day of June, 1912, incorporating Richmond Willie Hart, barrister-at-law, George Merle Miller, student-at-law, Pearl Stokers, Jessie Strachan and Winifred Morgan, stenographers, all of the City of Toronto, in the Province of Ontario, for the following purposes, viz:

- (a) To acquire by purchase, lease, exchange or otherwise, and to use, hold and improve lands, tenements, hereditaments, movables and interest therein and generally to carry on business of a land company and real estate agency with the power of renting, exchanging, selling and otherwise dealing in real estate and any interest or right therein.
- (b) To develop, improve and lay out any such property in building lots, streets, lanes, squares or otherwise, and upon such property make, construct, build and maintain roads, bridges and other internal communications, houses, mills, factories and other buildings necessary or expedient to an occupation or improvement of any such property.
- (c) To make advances by way of loans to purchasers or lessees of any part of the company's real estate for building purposes or other improvements, to aid by way of advances or otherwise in the construction and maintenance of roads, streets, waterworks, sewers and other works of improvement, calculated to render the company's property more accessible or to enhance its value.
- (d) To take and hold mortgages, hypothecs, liens and charges and to secure the payment of the purchase price of any property sold by the company or any money due to the company from purchasers or advanced by the company to purchasers for building purposes or other improvements.
- (e) To act as an agency or association for and on behalf of others who entrust the company with money, invest and also secure the repayment of the principal or the payment of the interest, or both, of any money entrusted with the company for investment, and for the purpose of securing the company against loss upon any guarantee or obligation of any advance made by the company and to receive and dispose of any description of assets or security which is conveyed, pledged, mortgaged or assigned to or warehoused with the company in connection with such guarantee, obligation, advance or investment, and to guarantee any investment made by the company as agent or otherwise.
- (f) To act as agents, or attorneys, for the management of estates, the sale of property, the investment, handling, payment, transmission and collection of moneys, rents, interests, dividends, mortgages, bonds, debentures and other securities and the undertaking of investigations, valuations, sales, exchanges, leases, subdivisions and the like.
- (g) To construct, build, repair, alter and equip buildings and other structures and to deal in any building requisites.
- (h) To construct, acquire and operate works for the production of power or force and deal in such power or force for any use or purpose for which the same may be adapted, subject to Provincial and municipal authorities.
- (i) To acquire letters patent of invention, patent rights, processes, concessions, licenses, trade marks, copyrights or any other privileges of like nature connected with any business for the purposes of the company, and to turn the same to account by manufacturing or working the same, or granting licenses in respect thereof or otherwise.
- (j) To purchase or otherwise acquire, or undertake all or any part of the business, property, assets or liabilities of any person, partnership or company carrying on business with objects similar in whole or in part to those of the company or possessed of property suitable and proper for the purposes of the company.
- (k) To apply paid up shares, bonds or debentures in payment either in whole or in part of any property real or personal, rights, claims, privileges, concessions or other advantages which the company may lawfully acquire, and also in payment, part payment or exchange for the shares, bonds, debentures or other securities of any other company doing a business similar in whole or in part incidental to the business of this company.
- (l) To purchase, acquire, hold and own shares of the capital stock, bonds or other securities of any other company, corporation or individual carrying on or engaged in any business which the company is empowered to carry on or engage in, and to acquire, hold or otherwise dispose of such shares, bonds or other securities, notwithstanding the provisions of section 44 of the Companies Act.
- (m) To enter into any arrangement for sharing of profits, union of interests, co-operation, joint adventures, reciprocal concession or otherwise with any person, partnership or company carrying on or engaged in or about to carry on any business or transaction which this company is authorized to carry on or to amalgamate with such company.
