St. Heliers, Jersey, Aug. 30.—Miss Vera Neave established a new women's record for a mile open swim today when she swam the distance in 31 minutes 41 1/2 seconds. The previous record was held by Miss Annette Kellerman, the Australian swimmer, whose time was 32 minutes 44 seconds.

Miss Neave is the holder of the 300 metre swimming record for women. She is well known in England as the winner of many local championships and she was the victor last year in a quarter mile race for women in the Thames.
