WESTERN CANADA METHODS; GOOD EXAMPLE FOR THE EAST

That the adoption of the method of land-value taxation in the western cities of Canada has been amply vindicated as wise was the one fact made clear at the opening meeting of the Union of Canadian Municipalities at Windsor. Alderman Clark of Edmonton, W. Hepburn of Vancouver and Mayor Beekwith of Victoria bore the strongest possible testimony to the successful working of the land tax principle in their respective cities. As was recently shown in a series of special articles in the Citizen, the cities mentioned have given the fullest trial to the new method and are in a position to speak authoritatively upon the subject. If results count, and no one will deny it, here is proof absolute of the worth of the principle. When abstract justice is combined with concrete profit, no further argument needs to be adduced.

It is to be hoped that the action of Mayor Bligh of Halifax and Mayor Beekwith of Victoria in uniting the Atlantic and the Pacific by their clasped hands will be significant of the further unity of common sense whereby the east will share the wisdom of the west and the adoption of the principle of taxation proved so worthy to be made of universal profit to the Dominion. If the east allows the west to outdo it in growth and general advancement during the next few years it will be because the one will take fuller advantage of sane modern methods than the other.

MINING NEWS FROM HAZELTON

(Omineca Miner)

An important discovery has been made on the American Boy group of Harris Mines. Jack Mullan having uncovered a foot of splendid ore on the Ore-Or-No Go claim. The company has over a car of ore sacked ready for shipment, and is adding to the pile daily. The ore is to be packed to the skidroad, where it will be held in readiness for freighting to the railroad as soon as the sleighing season opens.

The upper drift on the Rocher de Boule is expected to reach the big ore body within thirty feet. In the tunnel on the lower vein there is now five feet of good ore. A car is to be installed in this tunnel, on which another shift will be employed. Work on both tunnel and drift will be continued through the winter. The permanent camp is nearly completed including all necessary buildings for a large crew.

R. W. Thompson and Barney Halloran have purchased from P. McNicol, Alex. Jenkins and John Mann, eight claims on Rocher de Boule mountain, adjoining a group of nine claims already acquired by the purchasers. Messrs. Thompson & Halloran, who paid a good figure for their new property, will conduct prospecting operations this fall, and expect to arrange for development on a good scale next season.

Frank Martin is displaying a remarkable exhibit of native silver ore from the notable showing on the Hudson Bay mountain claims in which he and other local men are interested.

K. K. McLaughlin & Co., are making six hundred feet of air pipe for the big tunnel on the Surprise group.

The season's work on the Nine-Mile road has resulted in the establishment of a good wagon road to a point within about a mile of the Harris mines trail. As this property will ship continuous ore during the winter, application has been made for an additional appropriation sufficient to provide for the extension of the road to a point where connection can be had with a road from the mine. There is little doubt that the necessary work will be done.

Miss Helene J. Sloane of San Francisco, who has been touring in Alaska for the past three months, arrived in Prince Rupert yesterday on the steamer Spokane. Miss Sloane is a dramatic reader and will probably appear in Prince Rupert under the auspices of some society or church.
