waters of the springs be used for medicinal purposes, but will be used throughout the buildings for heating as well as general use.

Lakelse is situated in one of the best game districts in British Columbia, and a more desirable place for a vacation could not be imagined. Copper City is at present the nearest railway station. It is twelve miles from the lake, but a shorter route will soon be open. At the present time there is a big log hotel there, doing a good business, which will be superseded next spring by the more ambitious structure. Mr. Rochfort, who is secretary of the Stewart Land Co., with headquarters in Victoria, is a man of considerable experience and judgment in regard to pioneer development.

"The visitor to Prince Rupert who never goes farther than the townsite," said Mr. Rochfort, "can never get a true idea of this city's value and importance in the future. NEWS NOTES OF THE GREAT WEST

Work has been commenced on the Royal Alexandra Hotel, First street, Edmonton. The foundation is going in this fall and the building will be rushed to completion next season. It will be six storeys in height, and provision will be made for four additional storeys. It will contain two hundred rooms and cost \$350,000.

The Bank of Ottawa is building a \$100,000 addition at Winnipeg. An automobile manufacturer says the prosperity of Calgary is evident from the large number of cars ordered here.

Victoria street car passengers from September 1st to 7th, 1912, numbered 221,400. During the same period in 1911 they totalled 192,935. Building permits from September 1st to 7th, this year, were \$72,700. Last year they were \$54,850.

Bylaws carrying water and light extensions, and hydro-electric plant for using unlimited power and amounting to \$450,000, passed by big majority at Kamloops.

The Vancouver Progress Club has completed moving to permanent quarters, and is now busy preparing for opening the permanent provincial resources exposition. Vancouver will be the Pacific port for grain from eighty elevators in Alberta and Western Saskatchewan recently purchased by Sir Max Aitken and associates. The city awards a \$415,000 contract for a street viaduct.

A progressive farmer on the North Thompson River, twelve miles from Kamloops, is preparing an agricultural show in an exhibit hall built by himself on his own farm, to demonstrate the fertility of the soil of the valley and the success attained through intelligent farming. The scheme is a new one and must prove beneficial.

The estimated average yields of wheat in the Regina district this year are 19.6 bushels to the acre, against 18.5 last year.
