Cotton challenge cup, which he won at Vancouver in an exciting finish with Mr. Cotton himself, who entered for his own trophy. It was only with the last stone that Mr. Bruce was able to win.

Paddy Meehan meets Phil Bloom at the Irving Athletic Club, New York, tomorrow, while Kilbane and Eddie O'Keefe met last night.

Tesreau, the New York Giants' recruit pitcher, whose wonderful work is rapidly putting McGraw's team in a safe lead in the National League race, doesn't show any signs of weakening. Yesterday he shut Chicago out, letting the Cubs down with three hits.

It has been announced in a Vancouver paper that a post season series of seven games may be played between the Vancouver and Victoria ball teams. It is doubtful that anything will come of the proposal, as the majority of the Bees plan to get off to their homes the day after the last game, on September 28th.

By the margin of eight points Canada failed to wrest from the crack fillemen of the United States the coveted Palma trophy. The total scores were: United States, 1,720; Canada, 1,712, out of a possible 1,800.

"Mike" Gibbons, of St. Paul, showed such superiority over Young McCartney, when they met at Philadelphia in their scheduled six round bout at the National A. C., that the referee stopped the fight. McCartney lay helpless on the floor when the gong sounded at the end of the second round.

A baseball team to be composed largely of Pacific Coast League players, with the addition of a few major league stars, probably will make a tour of Australia next winter, if the plans of J. Cal. Ewing and A. J. C. Kelly, of Sydney, who is also head of the Australian baseball managers, besides being the representative of Hugh McIntosh and the other fight promoters of Australia, materialize. It is planned to take fifteen of the best known players who will consent to make the trip, including two extra pitchers and catchers, who are to be loaned to the Australian clubs in the games. The promoters of the idea intend to sail from San Francisco on November 18th and return on January 11th. Games will also be played at Honolulu.

## WHO WILL BE THE IDOL OF NEXT SEASON?

Every world's series has had its hero. Men who have passed through championship series with great credit have entered the baseball classic in the autumn and have failed, while some unknown hero has arisen to carve for himself a name in the annals of sport.
