McGoorty knocked out Dave Smith, the Australian champion, in one round, and now just a night or two ago he knocked out Jack Harrigan, the English champion, in one round.

England is sending over another white hope to regain the laurels Bombardier Wells lost when here. This hope's name is Tom Cowler. Harry Clark, third baseman of the Milwaukee Club in the American Association, was appointed manager of the team to succeed Hugh Duffy by Mrs. Agnew Havnor, president and owner of the club. Duffy resigned as manager.

The Boston Club were given a big reception when they returned home from their western tour. Business was stopped for a short time, and nearly all the city turned out to welcome the players on their return. The whole city is baseball crazy. Pittsburg are rapidly climbing on Chicago in the National League. In the last couple of weeks they have been coming strong. If the Cubs do not hurry they will be overtaken by the Pirates. A game and a half is all that separates them.

Bill Nolan is not anxious for Willie Ritchie to fight Ad. Wolgast for the title. Nolan turned down a \$3,000 offer to fight Wolgast on Thanksgiving Day at Taft, Cal. Nolan wants \$10,000 out of \$20,000 for Ritchie's share. Matthewson's record for thirteen years against the Pittsburg Pirates shows that Matty has pitched 77 games against them, winning 42, losing 32 and tying 3. He won 20 and lost 14 in Pittsburg, but at the Polo Grounds he captured only 22 out of 40.

Bill Barrenkamp, formerly with Seattle and later with Calgary in the Twilight League, has an average of .800, having won twelve games and lost three. He led the league and it was through him and Pete Standridge that Calgary won the pennant. Tommy Burns is trying to arrange a fight between Young Togo, the Japanese bantamweight, and Jimmy Walsh, of Boston, for some holiday date. It would be better if Burns would bring up Eddie Campi from San Francisco to meet Walsh, as Campi gave Togo a bad beating not long ago.

The Freddie Welsh-Matt Wells fight, which was to have taken place in England on October 21st, has been postponed to November 11th, as Welsh has matches in America which he has to fill. Jiggs Donahue, once famous Chicago White Sox star, is in the Ohio State insane asylum. In a game a short time ago between Philadelphia and Detroit, with the bases jammed and two out, Maggett came to bat and singled, yet not one run was scored. Lapp was on third, Crabb on second and Murphy on first. Maggett hit a hard line down short and the ball struck Crabb as he was running to third and the side was out. Detroit won the game, 8-6.

Johnny Kilbane is outgrowing the featherweight limit. In his bout with Johnny Dundee, in New York, a short time ago, Kilbane weighed 125 1/2 pounds. Now he should not kick about his match with Jim Driscoll, the English champion, over weight conditions. The Chicago-Cleveland series for the year ended in a draw, each team winning eleven games, although the Sox had a big lead over the Naps at one time.

V. A. C. BOXER MEETS SCALER

Ernie Barrieau, Amateur Champion of Canada, Will Meet Kid Scaler at Edmonton.

Vancouver, Sept. 30.—Ernie Barrieau, amateur lightweight champion of the Pacific Northwest, will make his debut into the professional ranks on October 12th, when he meets "Kid" Scaler, the Spokane lightweight, at Edmonton. Chester McIntyre, physical director of the V. A. C., received a wired from the Edmonton promoters that Scaler was willing to meet the amateur champion and he "cinched" the match by a return wire. Just what Barrieau will draw down for his initial bow into professionalism was not announced, but with McIntyre handling the managerial reins, it can be taken for granted that Ernie was well looked after.

Barrieau, accompanied by McIntyre, will leave for the scene of battle on Thursday morning, October 3rd. The champion will make his last appearance as an amateur the night previous, when with his brother Frank they will stage a ten round exhibition as a wind-up to the boxing contests scheduled for the V. A. C. on that evening.
