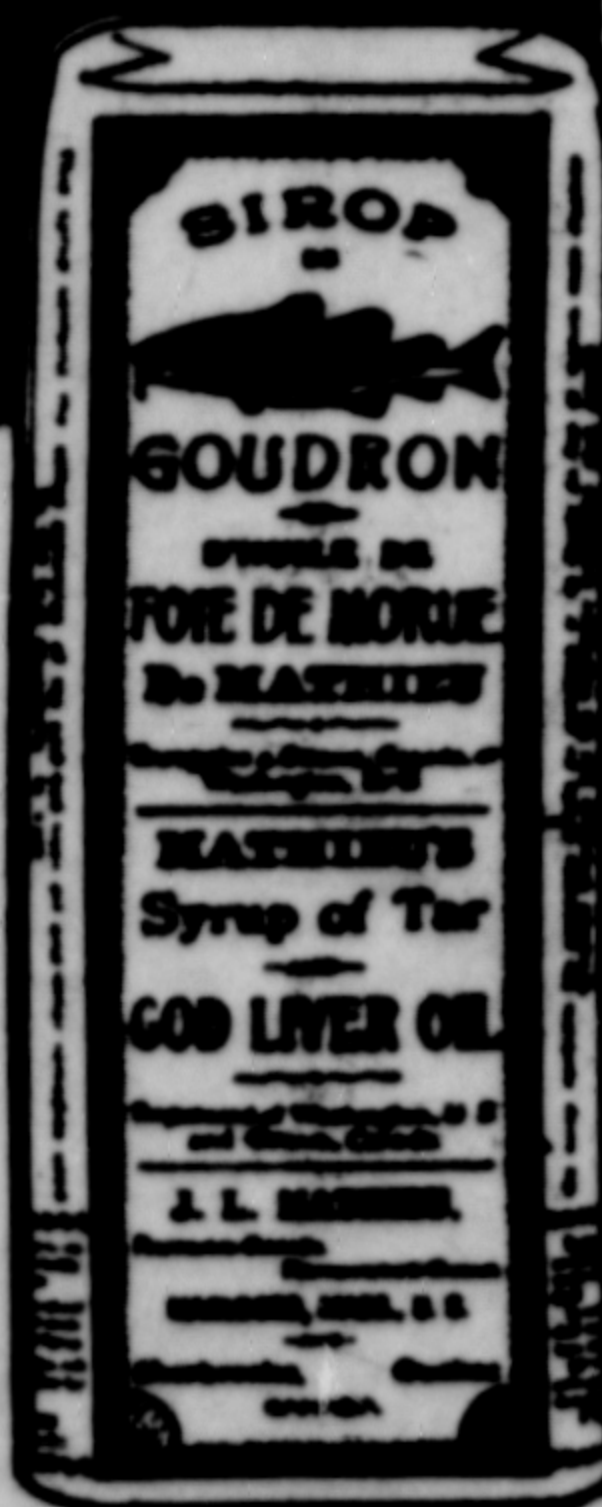

### Council Asked to Give Franchise

(Continued from Page 1.)

Alderman Bullock - Webster fathered a motion to prohibit the city's flags and bunting being loaned to any but the hospital and Daughters of the Empire for their approaching festivities.

A warm discussion took place on the question, Alderman Montgomery fighting for the flag. They were the property of the citizens and in the matter of flags he would not take such measures. And on the vote he opposed the motion.

The Council went into a committee of the whole with Alderman Montgomery in the chair to consider the proposal of the Hydro-Electric Power Company.

All the aldermen and His Worship took part in the resulting discussion, which lasted for nearly an hour. City Solicitor Peters advised the Council to "go slow" and not get into the same fix as the Vancouver and Victoria municipalities had done in giving franchises too freely. He advised them as to the proper manner in granting a franchise.

It was finally decided to ask the company to submit a proposal to deliver the power at the city gates, and the committee arose without report.

### SANITARY LAWS ARE ENFORCED

Man Found Guilty of Infringing on Sanitary Bylaws Is Given One Day to Clean Up.

Considerable time was taken up in the police court this morning over a case preferred by Sanitary Inspector McFarlane against James Postula, an Italian, for an infraction of one of the city health bylaws.

The accused in a most voluble and belligerent manner declared his innocence, stating that he was fully aware of his obligations in the matter and did not consider that he had failed in this respect in any way. The specific charge was that he allowed a quantity of manure to be dumped just off the roadway on the corner of Ninth avenue and McBride to the annoyance of the residents of the neighborhood, also that he did not provide for the proper sanitary arrangements of property rented out by himself to various tenants. The Magistrate gave him 24 hours to comply with the regulations, or take the consequences of paying a heavy fine.

### MONEY PLENTIFUL IN SOUTHERN ALBERTA

Crandston, Alta., Oct. 1—Early harvesting in the Crandston district is responsible for the marked uplift and activity now being noted in general business conditions. Money appears to be plentiful, especially for buildings and general investment purposes and farmers and cattlemen are reported as uniformly prosperous. The second large shipment of the year of cattle from the States is now booked for this point, consisting of 7,000 stockers just purchased in Oklahoma for the account of R. Knight, of the Knight Sugar Company.
