MEDICINE HAT IS ADVANCING

Prairie City Claims to Have the Greatest Building Advancement in Canada.

Medicine Hat, Alta., Oct. 2.—The announcement that Medicine Hat is leading all Canadian cities this year for building record is taken quite generally here as a matter of course; in fact, this condition was freely forecasted several months ago by insiders familiar with basic facts. As early as last April, R. H. Knight, civil engineer, while stopping over here in the interest of Edmonton investors, stated: "I am especially impressed with the large number of new industries that are now locating in Medicine Hat, although the surprising feature is that this opportunity was not taken advantage of much sooner. With the development that is now going ahead in Western Canada, with the central location of the city, together with nature's gift of gas for lighting, fuel and power, Medicine Hat cannot help but become a great manufacturing centre."

At the time when Mr. Knight made this statement the average daily record of building permits had jumped to ten times the daily average for the corresponding period of last year. As yet no lull in construction operations is noted, and it is believed the record of building permits should easily pass the \$3,000,000 mark long before winter.
