BEING RAPIDLY COMPLETED BATTTLE FOUGHT WITH TURKS; PATRIOTS ARE LEAVING B.C.

Paris, Oct. 8---War has been declared in the Balkans by Montenegro and a move has been made by the principality against Turkey. Troops are already pouring across the frontier and it is hourly expected that the other states involved will declare open hostilities and proceed against the Uttoman.

Already the Turks and Montenegrins have met in battle on the Turkish side of the frontier and although it is known that a large number of men were involved in a desperate struggle, no definite word of the outcome or the casualities has been received.

The foreign office has been informed of the fact that the Montenegrin charge d'affairs at Constantinople asked for and was granted his passports, and has withdrawn from Turkey.
