Following is the armed strength, on peace and war footing, of Turkey and the four kingdoms that have mobilized their forces to attack her:

Footing. Footing Turkey's standing army,

while carried at 375,000 on a peace footing, consists, in fact, of only about 120,000 men absolutely under arms. The Turkish forces are widely scattered through European Turkey and Asia Minor, while many of her troops have been sent into Tripoli, where she is at war with Italy.
