NAVAL PROBLEM TO COME FIRST

Borden Will Outline His Naval Policy at the First Party of the Opening of the House

Ottawa, Oct. 17—When parliament opens the first question which will be taken up after the address in reply to the speech from the throne is disposed of, will be the navy problem. Premier Borden will make an announcement outlining the policy of the government.

Another important measure which will be introduced as soon as the House opens will be the Bank Act revision. Hon. W. T. White already has the bill prepared so there will be no delay and the banking committee will be able to start work on it as soon as the House opens.

The Bill to confirm the treaty with the West Indies will be introduced as soon as Hon. Geo. E. Foster returns from England, where he is attending the sessions of imperial trade and commerce, which is expected to be about December 1. It will be pushed through the House by January 1.

The Highways Act will also likely be brought down shortly after parliament re-assembles.

Some minor additions to the Civil Service Act are likely to be introduced this fall. Just when the bill with wider reforms will be introduced depends on when the report of Sir Louis Murray is ready. He has been given full power to make an investigation and the government hopes to have his report in time to introduce legislation before the close of the session.

Engine Went Off Track

Completely blocking vehicular traffic both to and from the G. T. P. wharf, the 45-ton construction engine of Messrs. Foley, Welch & Stewart ran off the track just by the crossing at Centre street yesterday afternoon. It was not very long before a gang of men were put to work and with blocks and jacks had the big engine back into its place on the rails. Quite a crowd of interested spectators gathered around and watched the operations, whilst a string of teams were held up in idleness for a couple of hours or so.

Work on Granby Wharf

O. B. Smith Jr. and P. Boyles, a well known mining man from Spokane, are in the city, registered at the G. T. P. Inn. They will remain here a few days before proceeding on to the property of the American Smelting & Refining Co. at Granby Bay. Mr. Smith says that work on the projected new wharf will be proceeded with at all possible speed. Contractor Hyatt being already on the ground with a big pile driver to start in upon the work.

The steamer Prince John arrived from the Islands last evening, more than twenty-four hours overdue owing to the rough weather of the last few days. She left as soon as possible upon her delayed schedule run to Masset.

RE VOTERS' LIST.

I am instructed by the City Council to publish the following notice with regard to voting at the next municipal election. The persons who will be inserted on the voters' list are as follows:
1. Owners of real estate. This means any person who has a deed of land registered in the Land Registry Office or an agreement for purchase of land registered in the Registry Office.
2. Any person holding a trade license may vote, but before doing so he must, in October, make a declaration showing his right to vote in Form 1. These forms can be obtained at the City Clerk's office. The declaration must be filed with the City Clerk within forty-eight hours after it is made.
3. Any householder can vote. A householder means a person who has resided in Prince Rupert from the 1st of January, 1912, and who occupies a dwelling, tenement, hotel or boarding house, or any portion of a dwelling house, tenement, hotel or boarding house. He must also pay rates, taxes or assessments which are not chargeable on land, and which rates, taxes and assessments so paid amount to not less than \$2.00. Water rates and dog licenses do not count. Practically the only tax that can be paid is the road tax, \$2.00, and any person who, being a householder as above described, has already paid his road tax must also make a declaration before he can be placed on the voters' list.
All voters must be 21 years of age and British subjects.
