BAYLEY IS POUNDED BUT KEEPS FRESH TO END OF BIG BOUT

JOE BAYLEY UNACUSTOMED TO HITTING IN CLINCHES TOOK AN AWFUL AMOUNT OF PUNISHMENT BUT CAME UP SMILING EACH ROUND

Calgary, Oct. 29. — Although Fighting Dick Hyland pounded the face off Joe Bayley, the holder of the lightweight champion- ship of Canada, almost to a pulp, Referee Tommy Burns called the 15-round bout a draw. Burns' decision was based on Bayley's ability to stand the fearful pun- ishment and come up fresh in the last round of what proved to be one of the best fights ever staged in this city. Though Bayley was the favor- ite when time was called, it re- quired only one round to demon- strate that he would have all he could do to hold his title against the fierce onslaughts of the San Francisco boy. Bayley took the fight to Hyland all the way through, but this was largely be- cause of the fact that he realized immediately his only chance lay in keeping clear of the deadly blows that the California lad rained upon him in the clinches. Bayley had been accustomed to fighting under the clean break rules and when he went up against an adept in the Marquis of Queensbury rules, with the principals protecting themselves at all times, he was sorely puzzled. Manager of St. Louis Nationals Will Fight Against Being Discharged from Team

St. Louis, Oct. 30.—"Fight? Am I going to fight? Well, I guess yes." Roger Bresnahan, deposed manager of the St. Louis Nationals, said on Tuesday. "I am ready to fight for my rights and will go into any court they want me to. I never quit on the ball field and I won't quit now." Rumors were in circulation that President Robert J. Hedges, of the St. Louis Americans, was after Bresnahan to manage his club next season and was ready to pay the catcher the \$10,000 a year his contract with the St. Louis Nationals called for, but not the 10 per cent. of the profits. It is believed Bresnahan would be peculiarly valuable to the local Americans because of his ability to steady young pitchers. The American team has a number of promising youngsters.
