JOE'S CHANCES IN AUSTRALIA

Antipode Sport Thinks Joe Bayley Would Do Well in Australia
—Clean Fighting.

Writing to a friend in Victoria James C. Bendrodt, a well known local athlete a few years ago and now manager of a big roller skating concern in Sydney, Australia, says that the greatest sport in Australia at the present time is boxing. Bendrodt has kept in touch with Joe Bayley's performances and thinks that there is a splendid chance for the little champion out in the land of the kangaroo.

Some interesting extracts from Bendrodt's letter follow: "Hugh D. McIntosh's stadium is an enormous place. It is all roofed in now and fights are staged rain or shine. Sydney is full of fighting men from all parts of the world and every ship brings more of them. I saw Langford and McVey fight here twice. Langford will beat McVey any time by reason of the fact that he is a fighting machine pure and simple, with the heart of a lion and the strength of a gorilla. McVey is once the possessors of big bank accounts and spent money like water. Somehow a curious fatality seems to have pursued the footsteps of most of the famous featherweights of the Queensbury ring."

The reason is, of course, that among the sports who throng the Great White Way, there are many veterans who knew the former gladiators when they were in their prime and are willing to loosen up a bit for the sake of old times.
