This is called "half mast." Did you ever stop to think what connection there could be between a flag that was not properly hoisted and the death of a great man?

Ever since flags were used in war it has been the custom to have the flag of the superior or conquering nation above that of the inferior or vanguished. When an army found itself hopelessly hopelessly beaten it hauled its Fou flag down far enough for the flag of the victors to be placed above it on the same pole. This was taken not only of submission but of respect.


