Since January of this year enumeration has been carried out throughout the Province as required, to bring voters lists up to date. Notices have now been mailed to all persons who are registered as voters in the Atlin Electoral District.

Any person residing in this electoral district who does not receive his notice during the next seven days must consider that he is not registered. Any such person, if qualified should apply for registration without delay.

Note that no further door-to-door canvass is to be made. You will not be called on at your home but must apply at the Registrar of Voters Office, Court House, Prince Rupert. Forms for making application will be mailed by the Registrar to any one requesting them by letter or telephone 2121, Prince Rupert, and ask for Voters Office. Registration forms may also be obtained from the Government Sub-Agents at Stewart and Telegraph Crock and the Government Agent, Atlin, B.C.

The Registrar of Voters Office is open from Monday to Friday each wook from 9 A.M. to 12 noon and 1:10 P.M. to 5:00 P.M.

Qualifications for registration are:

1. 19 years of ago or over.

2. British Subject or Canadian Citizen.

3. Residing in Canada for the past 12 months. 4. Residing in British Columbia for the past 6 months.
