LAWYER for Carl Furillo, above, Wednesday night accused the Los Angeles Dodgers of violating their contract with the veteran outfielder and said a lawsuit "is not impossible by any means." Furillo, who hit .300 in 14 seasons in the majors was given his outright release Tuesday. "We are not planning at this time to sue the club," attorney Arnold Cowan told The Associated Press. "But we are going to bring the matter before the commissioner of baseball in accordance with provisions of the contract." Furillo's release "does not fall within the section of the contract giving the ball club the right to put a player on waivers and give him his release."



NEWTOWN, Conn. (A)—Remember when Max Schmeling said "I zee someding" about Joe Louis and then knocked him

Well, Joe Louis says he "sees something" about Ingemar Johansson that will help Floyd Patterson regain the world heavyweight boxing title in his June 20 rematch with the

The Brown Bomber, who bounced back to annihilate Schmeling in one round in their rematch in 1938, picks Patterson to stop Johansson the second time around.

"I can't see it in four or five rounds," Louis said Wednesday at Patterson's training camp. "It should take him seven or 10 rounds to catch up with him." Louis said he found many flaws in Johansson's styles

while watching films of the fight last June 26 when Ingemar stopped Patterson at 2:03 of the third round.

"I don't think Johansson can hit Patterson with that righ hand again. And that is his only punch. His jab is just a leading punch so he can throw the right hand."
