ARRESTED AND CHARGED WITH MURDER OF CHILD

Man Believed to Be the Postal Card Murderer Is Arrested.

New York, Nov. 30.—John H. Hickey was brought here last night from Toms River, N. J., and locked up in a police station until this morning, when he was taken on the Empire State express to Buffalo. While at headquarters Hickey was identified as a man who was arrested as a suspect ten years ago in the case of the murder of Michael Kruck, a newsboy, in Central Park. Hickey admitted he was arrested for that crime and subsequently released, as was stated recently by officials of the local police department.

Chief of Police Gilson, of Lackawanna, who has Hickey in charge, showed the prisoner two letters Hickey sent to a friend last summer. The letters were on commonplace matters, but the writing, according to Gilson, is very similar to the writing on the cards which led up to the finding of the body of the Josephs boy. According to Gilson, Hickey last night admitted he wrote the letters to the Boston friend, although he denies writing the postcards.

Gilson said that Hickey had also admitted that he was in Boston on November 9 and in this city on November 12. On November 9 Gilson received a postcard regarding the Josephs murder from Boston and another was posted to Gilson on November 12 from this city.

Dies of Broken Heart.

Los Angeles, Nov. 30.—Mrs. L. Enert, 65, is dead of a broken heart. She sank to the ground lifeless in Rosedale Cemetery as the body of her dearest friend, Mrs. Matilda L. Wilson, was being lowered to its final resting place. Throughout the funeral services Mrs. Enert's grief had been intense, and as the casket disappeared into the blossom lined vault, she sat down by the grave and then collapsed. She was dead when her daughter reached her side.

Seattle Merchants Duped.

Seattle, Nov. 30.—Declaring that Seattle merchants are duped out of at least \$100,000 a year by fakirs, who solicit advertising for pamphlets and programmes under guise of getting money for charitable purposes, the Ad. Club of this city is pledged to lead to a "show them up" campaign. Each merchant will be asked to sign an agreement not to give money or buy advertising from solicitors unless they show proper credentials.
