RUSSIA MUST WAR OR YIELD HER POSITION IN MONGOLIA

OPINION IN CHINA IS THAT RUSSIA MUST EITHER FIGHT OR WITHDRAW FROM MONGOLIA—TERMS OF THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN MONGOLIANS AND RUSSIANS.

Pekin, Dec. 3.—The Chinese occupation of the Mongolian town of Kobdo directly raises the issue of China's right to put down the Mongolian independence movement, it was stated, and as Russia is pledged to support the movement the Czar has no choice but to yield or fight.

Following the Mongolian declaration of independence, which the Chinese accuse the Russians of hiring a few chieftains to issue, golian government entered into Russia and the so-called Mongolian secret treaty, according to the foreign office here, to the following effect:

The Mongolian rulers to have authority over their own people but to act on whatever advice they received from St. Petersburg.

Russia to lend the Mongolian rulers £13,850,000, with the whole of Mongolia, a territory a third the size of Europe, as security.

Russia is to supervise Mongolia's finances.

Mongolia to cede territory to no country but Russia.

Paste for Applique Work.

Obtain some resin very fine and take as much of it as will lie on a sixpence; mix this with a tablespoonful of flour, and then in the ordinary way make a very stiff paste. Add a few drops of oil of cloves and do not use it until quite cold. It must be so dry that when put on silk or velvet it will not penetrate the fabric.

Lemon Toffee.

Nothing is more soothing for a troublesome cough than good home made toffee. Put one pound of brown sugar into a saucepan with two ounces of fresh butter and half a teaspoonful of milk and boil until a little dropped in cold water will set firm. Then flavor to taste with lemon juice and pour into a buttered tin. When half cold mark off into squares and when quite cold break these.
