RICH STRIKE MADE ON RED REEF AT STEWART

Copper and Galena Find is Very Rich—Half Mile from Stewart.

Word has just been received that a rich strike of copper and galena has been made upon the Red Reef mining property, located about half a mile from Stewart, upon the face of the mountain at the head of Portland Canal.

This group of claims, which are owned by Mr. H. G. Newton, a Victoria capitalist, have been steadily undergoing a process of development during the last summer.

Over a dozen men are employed. Mr. Newton himself is at present upon the ground. Further particulars are expected to be received upon the next boat from Stewart.

MACHINE GUN TAKEN TO PROTECT TROOP TRAIN

Mexican Rebels Molest Railway and Soldiers Take Cannon on Car.

(Special to Daily News.)
El Paso, Tex., Dec. 6.—A machine gun borrowed from a Mexican gunboat is being used to protect a troop train which left Juarez to patrol the railways between the state capital and the border.

The gun is mounted on a flat car. The train, carrying 500 troops, departed over the Mexican Northwestern Railway shortly after arriving over the Mexican Central line. It is planned to continue making this loop between Chihuahua City and Juarez.

Some troops, with two mortars, will proceed overland to the assistance of Federals besieged at Ascension by Salzar's rebels.

BRITISH STEAMER WAS NOT LIABLE TO STATE

United States Law Has No Jurisdiction Over Foreign Boats.

(Special to Daily News.)
Norfolk, Va., Dec. 6.—United States Judge Waddill, in the case against the British steamer Sokoto, whose master was indicted for violation of the Federal "wireless act," decided that a foreign vessel entering an American port merely for bunker coal was not subject to the act.

When the Sokoto, regularly engaged in the Canada-Mexico trade, put in at Newport News last December for bunker coal her master was arrested for the failure to have wireless equipment.
