THE EMERGENCY CONTRIBUTION.

Now that Borden has explained his naval policy and has provided for the building, but not for the maintenance, of three dreadnaughts of the latest type, as an "emergency" contribution, the matter can be discussed in the proper light.

For the past few months the Empire has been worked to a straining point over this announcement and with all the ingenuity of the campaign managers of the government and their European allies the climax has been worked up to with the idea in sight of stampeding the Canadian people into accepting the naval policy in a burst of flag waving and enthusiasm. One of the final coups, however, failed entirely and did not have the desired effect. This was the statement made a week before the Canadian government's naval policy was to be revealed that several Indian rajahs were to give a whole fleet of dreadnaughts and cruisers. The order was too large however, and the nation would not accept it. The idea, instead of having the desired effect on the people of

Canada only resulted in ridicule in the press and the Parliament of Great Britain.

We cannot see how the three battleships are to form an "emergency." In the first place, we would like a definition of the word "emergency" as it is used by the government. We were under the impression that an emergency was a temporary affair and not a condition lasting for several years.

According to the statements made in the Reichstag and by the British ministers, there is a growing feeling of friendship between Great Britain and Germany, and there is no possibility of a war between those two nations. Where, then, is the emergency?

Laurier prepared a policy that was accepted by the British admiralty and was agreed upon by both sides of the House as the sane and only naval policy for Canada as a part of the great British Empire. It provided for the building and maintenance of a navy by Canadians, and as far as the information received here in regard to Borden's policy we cannot see why it should be abandoned.

MAN WHO SHELTERED GUNMAN IS ARRESTED

Accused of Sheltering "Gyp the Blood" Kramer is Jailed

Chicago, Dec. 7.—Samuel Kramer, wanted in New York in connection with the Rosenthal murder, was arrested here by detectives after a desperate resistance, in which Kramer was beaten into unconsciousness.

Kramer is 23 years old, and is known under a number of other names. He was charged with having sheltered "Gyp the Blood" and his two companions in his Brooklyn home after the Rosenthal murder. Kramer was indicted as an accessory by the grand jury, but escaped from the house of detention where he was being held.

PEACE ENVOYS ARE PUT TO DEATH BY INSURGENT

Rebel Leader Kills Men Who are Sent by Government to Offer Terms

Mexico City, Dec. 6.—Emiliano Zapata, the insurgent leader, carrying out a recent threat that he would put to death any additional peace envoys sent by the government to treat with him, a few days ago passed the sentence of death on two men who had approached him on behalf of the government, according to the news received here today from Excuatular, Morelos.

One of these men was shot, the other escaped.

A despatch from the Imparcial from Vera Cruz says that W. W. Canada, with American consul, has informed the correspondent of the Imparcial that the United States battleships Kansas, Michigan, Vermont and South Carolina soon will visit Vera Cruz.

The news has caused apprehension here, as it is considered unusual that naval visits of courtesy should be in such strength.

INITIATIVE AND RECALL MAY BE ADOPTED IN US

Changes Proposed in the Constitution of the United States

Washington, Dec. 6.—The adoption of initiative and the recall of judicial decisions, as amendments to the federal constitution, was proposed by Senator Bristowe in resolutions laid before the Senate. Senator Bristowe's first resolution would permit the President to submit to popular vote at a congressional election any measure he has recommended to Congress, and upon which no action has been taken for six months.

Melbourne, Dec. 5.—Numbers of Federal House representatives are urging the government to consider the inauguration of the referendum on similar lines to that of the United States.

Attorney General Hughes considers, however, that the government's proposals to amend the Constitution will suffice for the present, and that the introduction of the initiative and referendum would be inadvisable.
