## Selective tree trade to States

VANCOUVER (P)-J. R. Nicholson, president of the Council of the Forest Industries in British Columbia, called Monday for selective free trade with the United States.

He asked for realism rather than pessimism in assessing economic prospects. Mr. Nicholon also:

. Proposed that the provincial government forego the five-percent sales tax on investment in new plants in B.C. as one move to ease unemployment.

2. Sought taxation reform to allow a federal income tax credit on provincial logging taxes, plus depreciation and depletion atlowances for the forest industry similar to those granted to oil and mining companies.

3. Urged labor to associate itself in the drive to abolish taxation inequities and in the fight for more equitable freight rates. 4. Said labor-management relations must improve if B.C. is to ittract the enormous invest ment required to keep the forest industry competitive with other world producers.

5. Warned that the red cedar shingle industry may continue to decline and eventually disappear unless labor co-operates in cost going to theatrical school for adjustments to keep it competitive with substitute products.
