PEKING (Reuters) -- The authorities have removed the "rightist" stigma from more than 1,270 persons in accordance with a 1959 decision to pardon those who have "really expressed their reform". The Peking People's Daily says the latest persons to be relieved of the designation were in "state offices, schools, cultural bodies, health departments, industrial and mining enterprises and local bodies of democratic parties."
