WAR WOULD DEPRIVE PARIS OF ALL FOOD

If France Goes to War Paris Will
be Starving in Three
Days

Paris, Dec. 10.—M. Galli, pre-
sident of the city council, called
on M. Millerand, Minister of War
and urged that the government
take steps to insure the effi-
ciency of the law of 1912, pro-
viding for the proper provision-
ing of Paris with wheat in case
of war.

M. Galli affirmed that if war
was declared tomorrow, Paris
would be without bread in three
or four days.

This was due, he said, to the
fact that all the railroads lead-
ing to Paris would be used for
the mobilization of troops and no
merchandise or food could be
brought to the metropolis.
