Young Man Seizes Bandit and Receives Wounds, but Lands His Man in Jail.

Vancouver, Dec. 13.—Gately tackling his man as he tickled his ribs with a gun, J. H. Sinclair, 1110 Bute street, grabbed George Wilson on Helmcken street, near Howe, when Wilson commanded him to hold his hands up. In the scuffle Sinclair was wounded twice, in the hand and in the arm. In the arrest of Wilson the police think they have the man who is guilty of a number of holdups about the city, and this morning they state their belief that Wilson is the daring bandit who held up the C. P. R. Imperial Limited.

The fight between the holdup man and his intended victim occurred shortly after midnight. Sinclair was walking to his home on Bute street and had turned up off Granville street to pass on Helmcken through to his home.

HEAD OF CARPENTERS' UNION WAS ARRESTED

Indianapolis, Ind., Dec. 13.—William H. Quigley, Detroit, business agent of the Carpenters' Union, was held to the Federal grand jury on the charge of the district attorney that he had committed perjury as a witness at the dynamite conspiracy trial. He was taken into custody by a deputy United States marshal. As the fourteenth of the forty-one defendants to appear in his own behalf, Michael J. Cunnane, a Philadelphia official of the International Association of Bridge and Structural Iron Workers, next testified.

"Before McNamara was taken to Los Angeles had you any knowledge that dynamite or nitroglycerine was used on non-union jobs?" asked William A. Gray, counsel for Cunnane.

"Never heard of it till McNamara's arrest."

Cunnane said his appearance before the international union's executive board was not to discuss dynamiting, but in connection with proposed "local option" for the Philadelphia union so the members might work for contractors who maintained union shops locally, regardless of the strike. As business agent, the witness said he helped settle many disputes peacefully. Cunnane, who is charged with implication in the illegal transportation of explosives because of letters he wrote to McNamara, explained he requested financial aid to unionized jobs by lawful means.
