INVITE LLOYD-GEORGE

Welshmen of Vancouver Would Have Chancellor of Exchequer Visit the City. Vancouver, Dec. 21.—The Rt. Hon. D. Lloyd-George is expected to attend the Welsh International Esteddofod at Pittsburg, Pa., next July and also to visit other cities in the east.

The Vancouver Cymrodion Society, wishing to take advantage of Mr. Lloyd-George's presence on the continent, have sent him a pressing invitation to visit Vancouver and deliver a public address under the society's auspices. The Welsh of Seattle have also invited the Chancellor to address them and in view of both invitations it is hoped by these societies that he will come to the Pacific Coast.

The Vancouver society is well organized and the president, Mr. D. G. Williams, of Williams & Murdoch, and Mr. Hywell Morgan, secretary, are supported by a strong executive committee.

CACHE OF DYNAMITE

Three Hundred Sticks Found by Boys at Los Angeles. Los Angeles, Dec. 21.—While playing along the bank of the Los Angeles River bed found a cache of dynamite within seventy-five feet of the East Side police station. Investigation by the police revealed three hundred sticks of the explosive. Experts say the dynamite is 75 per cent. nitroglycerine.

Famous Old Silver to Be Sold.

San Francisco, Dec. 21.—The Pacific Mail Steamship Company has called for tenders on the old steamer City of Panama, which was retired from service recently upon complaints of passengers that it was unseaworthy. Bids will be received on Friday. One of the conditions imposed upon the buyers will be that the vessel cannot be used as a steamer.

New Consul Named.

Washington, Dec. 21.—President Taft today sent to the Senate the nomination of Frederick Simplic of Washington to state to be consul at Nogales, Mexico.

Oregon Town Wins Rate Fight.

Washington, Dec. 21.—On complaint of the Baker (Oregon) Commercial Club the Interstate Commerce Commission today declared unreasonable the class rates from Baker City to points on the Oregon Short Line between Olds Ferry, Idaho, and Vale, Ore.

Socialist Vote in California.

Sacramento, Cal., Dec. 21.—California socialist candidates for Congress received a total vote of 104,122 in the November election, according to Statistician Cremin. The total vote received by the Socialist presidential candidate was a little over 79,000.

Los Angeles Man Testifies.

Cincinnati, O., Dec. 21.—Pres-ton McKinney, of Los Angeles, was one of the chief witnesses in the government's suit against the National Cash Register Company for alleged violation of the anti-Sherman trust law. The government expects to rest its case before Christmas.

Switzerland Prepares for War.

Berne, Switzerland, Dec. 21.—The Swiss government, in view of the possibility of war, is augmenting the amount of ready cash at its command. A consignment of \$5,000,000 in silver and gold arrived here yesterday by special train from Paris and was lodged in the Swiss National Bank. The government also continues to order quantities of grain from America.
