### CITY OF PRINCE RUPERT BY-LAW NO. 1458

A By-law of the City of Prince Rupert hereinafter Called the "City" to Make Improvements to the

Water Supply and Distribution System of the City and to Authorize the Borrowing of the Estimated Cost Thereof

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary and expedient to make improvements to the Water Supply and Distribution System serving the City of Prince Rupert and in that behalf to authorize the Council to undertake and cause to be carried out the said improvements and to borrow upon the credit of the City the estimated cost thereof this is to say \$1,565,000 00 which is the maximum amount of the debt intended to be created by this By-law.

AND WHEREAS the existing debenture debt of the City is \$1,875,426.00 and none of the principal and interest is in arrears; ! AND WHEREAS the assessed value for general municipal purposes of the taxable land and improvements within the City of Prince Rupert for the current year and for the two years immediately preceding the current year is:

\$ 17,539,781°

AND WHEREAS the depreciated value as at the 31st day of December 1959 of the utility systems for which the City possesses subsisting Certificates of self-liquidation granted by the Inspector of Municipalities is \$1,250,803.00;

AND WHEREAS the approval of the Inspector of Municipalities has been obtained; AND WHEREAS the approval of the Provincial Health Officer

has been obtained: NOW THEREFORE the Council of the City of Prince Rupert in open meeting assembled enacts as follows:

(1) That the Council shall be and is hereby empowered and authorized to undertake and carry out or cause to be carried out the improvements to the Water Supply & Distribution Systems as shown and described in the Report on Improvements to the Water Supply and Distribution System for the City of Prince Rupert 1960, and in the general plans approved by the Provincal Health Officer and is hereby empowered to do all things necessary in connection with the foregoing and without limiting the generality thereo is empowered and authorized:

(a) To operate and maintain the aforesaid works. (b) To apply for a Provincial Guarantee of the principal and

interest of and on-debentures hereinafter described and to do such other acts as may be necessary or expedient to obtain such guarantee. (c) To acquire all such property, easements, rights-of-way,

licenses, rights and authorities as may be requisite or desirable for or in connection with the works aforesaid. 2. That for the purpose and with the object aforesaid and subject to the provisions in that behalf hereinafter contained and set forth, there shall be borrowed upon the credit of the City a sum of \$1,565,000 and debentures shall be issued therefor in sums of not less, than \$1,000.00 each and having coupons attached thereto for the payment of interest, provided, however, that no debentures shall be issued hereunder unless and until the Province of British Columbia shall guarantee the payments required to be made for

principal and interest thereon. 3. That the said debentures shall be dated the First day of June, 1961, and shall be payable as to principal by twenty (20) consecutive annual instalments commencing the First day of June 1962, and shall bear interest at the rate of 51/2% per annum payable semi-annually on the First day of June and the First day of December, in each and every year during the currency thereof, the respective amounts of principal and interest and the total thereof payable in each year being as follows:


