A GOOD NAVAL POLICY.

"I am entirely of the opinion, in the first place, that the proper line upon which we should proceed in that regard is the line of having a Canadian naval force of our own. I entirely believe in that. The other experiment has been tried as between Australia and the Mother Country, and it has not worked satisfactorily in any respect. In Great Britain the contribution has perhaps been regarded as rather unsatisfactory. In Australia in the end it failed to meet with the approval of the people for the reason that Great Britain felt constrained to ask Australia that the field of operations of the squadron should

were so extended the Australians felt that the contribution which they had been making ince. for some years past was not really being used to give that protection to Australia which her interests demanded. that the policy of Australia at the present time is to build up a flotilla of submarines and torpedo craft which, in case of war, would co-operate with the armed cruisers and battleships of the British navy."

The above is taken from a speech by R. L. Borden, made in 1909, in regard to the naval policy which the House of Commons unanimously endorsed.




