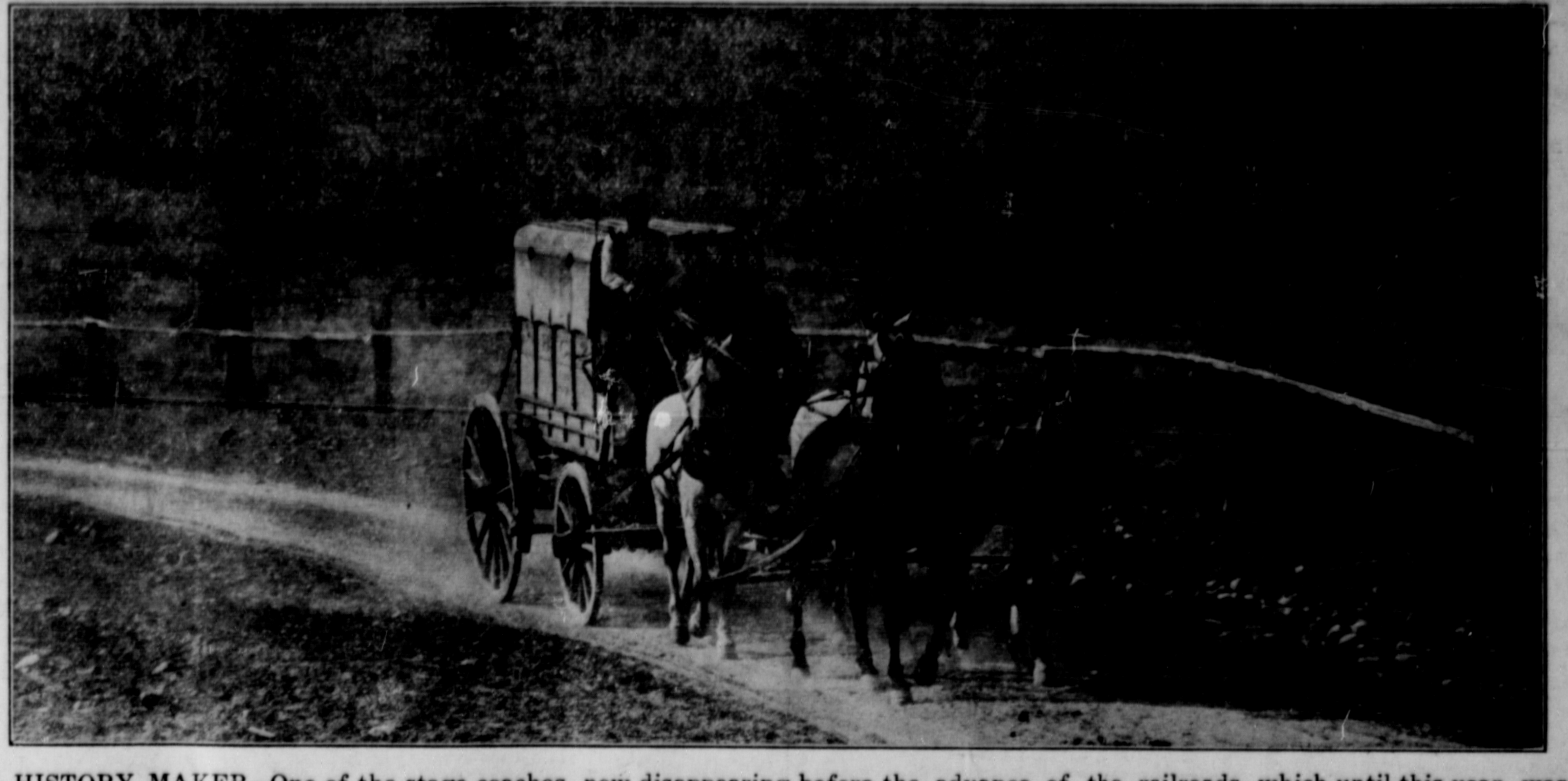

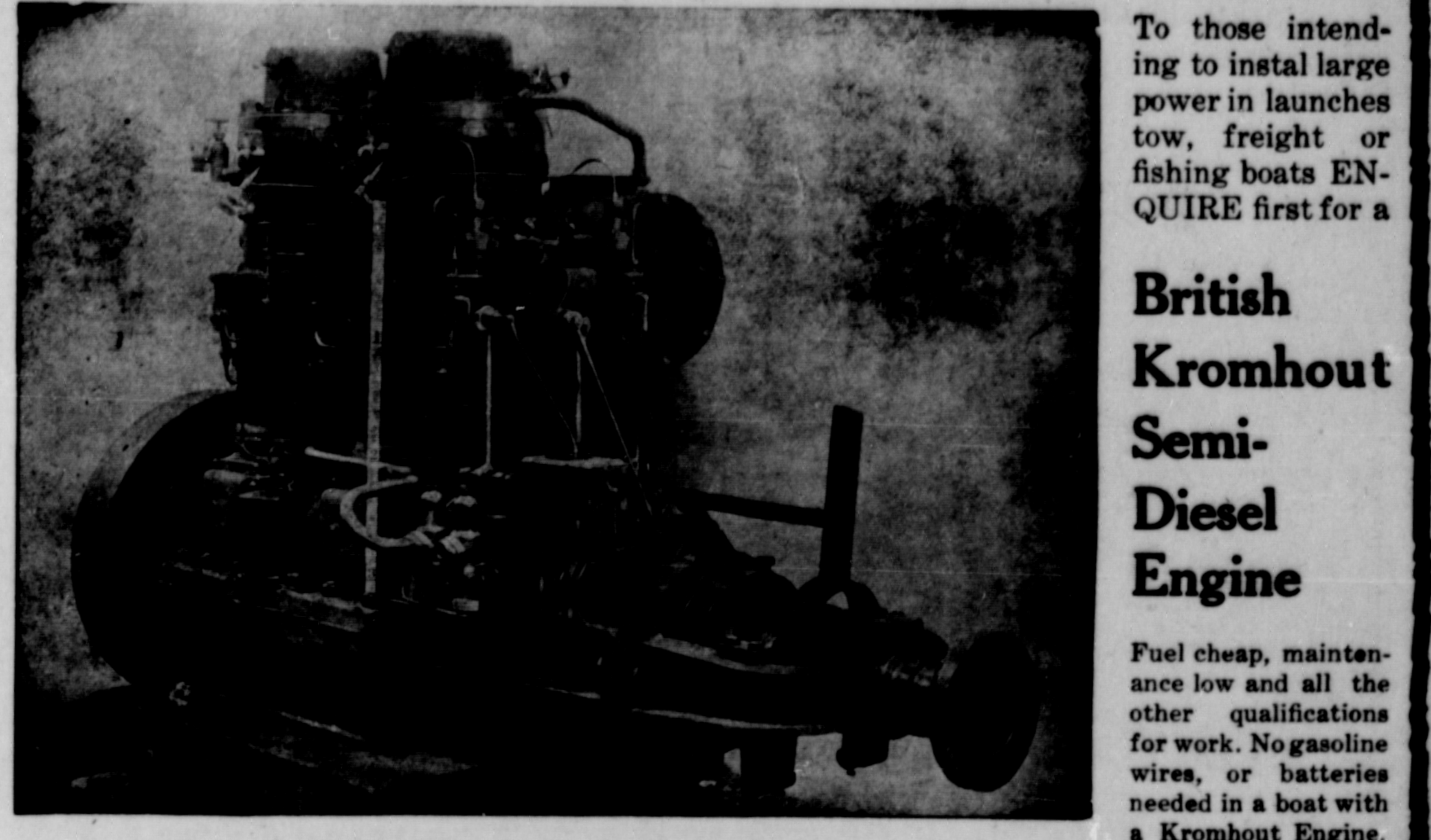
NELSON TO HOLD WINTER CARNIVAL IN JANUARY
