MANY WINDOWS BROKEN; ONE MAN WAS INJURED

PRINCE RUPERT USHERED IN THE NEW YEAR WITH ONE OF THE MOST TERRIFIC WIND STORMS EVER EXPERIENCED HERE.

Considerable damage was occasioned to the plate glass of the city by the storm yesterday morning. In this respect Prince Rupert was not the only city on the coast that suffered. Vancouver with its big solid buildings got a number of big plate glass fronts smashed also. Here in Prince Rupert Will J. Hughes' ladies' dry goods was the worst sufferer. The entire front of both his store and that part occupied by Miss Kuster's millinery department were completely shattered. At George Tite's furniture store, the Empress barber shop, Orme's drug store and several other places minor disasters to plate glass fronts were recorded.

LUCKY NUMBERS IN CASH PRIZE CONTEST
