### ANOTHER AEROPLANE

DESIGNER IN RUPERT

F. Brulard Has Perfected a Model Upon Which He Has Had Encouraging Reports

The story published in the Daily News a few days ago—of a youthful mechanical genius who had recently built an aeroplane in the city of Vancouver, has brought to light the fact that resident in this city is another young man who has aspirations along those lines. He is a Norwegian of the name of F. Brulard. During the last few months he has spent all his spare time, when not engaged upon his business as a painter, in perfecting an original model of an aeroplane, which he has lately completed.

Having sent a photograph of his finished achievement to a patent attorney in the United States, he has received a most encouraging report, together with a view to obtaining a patent upon his invention. The model itself is still in the city and anyone interested in such things would doubtless, through the courtesy of Alderman Dybbavn, who is a friend of the inventor, be given an opportunity of viewing the model in question.
