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WORLD'S SERIES COIN

Fielder Jones Thinks Players' Share Should Be Added to Fund. Portland, Ore., Jan. 8.—Fielder Jones, who at one time was the manager of the Chicago White Sox, and is now the president of the Northwestern League, believes that the players' share of the world's series money should go into a common fund to take care of broken down players. He states that this should be one of the first things the Players' Protective Association should take up. Jones shared in a big heap of money in 1906, when his club got 4 in on the winner's end of \$33,401.70, besides a bonus by President Comiskey of \$15,000. Jones brought up the subject when he was asked what he thought of Garry Hermann's proposition of rewarding each of the winning players with \$1,000 each and each of the losers with \$750, and then dividing the rest equally among all the other major league players.

Chicago, Jan. 10.—According to a law recently laid down by President Murphy of the Chicago National League club, the baseball players of his organization are on the "water wagon" today and hereafter during the 1913 season.
