BRITAIN AND GERMANY MAY FIGHT AT ANY MOMENT

GERMANY SEEMS ANXIOUS FOR A TRIAL OF STRENGTH—CLAIMS EQUAL RIGHT WITH ENGLAND TO MARKETS OF THE WORLD.

London, Jan. 15.—There have been fresh and highly interesting additions during the past week to the amazing series of defiant and incriminating articles which the English and German newspapers are constantly exchanging. If the press of two countries in any degree represents the real feeling of the people—and it must be acknowledged that at least nine Englishmen out of ten seem to feel that war with Germany is probable any clear afternoon—it does not seem possible that the two countries can be long kept apart.

The latest thing is the statement by the semi-official Berliner Lokal-Anzeiger that Germany has only succeeded within the last twelve months in freeing herself from the chains of England and France, and that "a decisive trial of strength has hitherto been spared us, but it will not fail to come. Therefore, we must rightly employ the respite still permitted us."

A previous article in the Lokal-Anzeiger is an illuminating commentary upon this statement. The earlier article developed the theory, which is seems strange has waited so long for publication, that Germany's desire was not for conquest, but for liberty to pursue her own legitimate ambitions in the affairs of the world. The line taken was that the contest of the present day was for supremacy; that Germany had an equal right with England to the markets of the world, and that Germany did not purpose to be bullied or overawed by the huge English navy until it withdrew from the world's commerce and accepted only the
