**WHY IMMIGRANTS COME TO CANADA**

Hundreds of thousands of immigrants are coming to Canada for two principal reasons: first, to take up land; and second, to work in factories. They follow the opportunity for employment. There is no limit of agricultural and industrial opportunities in Canada. For the next hundred years, farm lands will be available at reasonable prices; while factories and factory products will follow the pioneer. How fortunate is Canada, the country which possesses the two great attractions for immigrants!—Industrial Canada.

**CANADIAN PARCELS POST.**

The United States has just brought into being an effective parcels post service which promises to do great things for the common people of that country. The British Isles have enjoyed an efficient parcels post system for a considerable time, but in Canada to date the "interests" have been successful in blocking any parcels post service that would be of real advantage to the mass of the Canadian people. The former Federal government gave the people to understand that the time was at hand for such an innovation when it went down to defeat at the hands and through the influence of those "interests." Can it be possible that Mr. Borden and his government are deaf to the voice of the great mass of Canadian consumers

and blind to the advantages enjoyed by our brethren in England and in the United States?

Everyone knows that our present parcels post is merely the first step toward an adequate service and that it is high time that the express companies forego their too exclusive monopoly in the interest of the multitudinous consumer. But as yet the Conservative government, although in power for nearly a year and a half, has not shown any disposition to advance in this regard; but it has ever been thus. The Conservative party in Canada, from the days of the regime of the Family Compact, has identified itself with the privileged classes, of which it is part, on which it depends, for which it exists and on which it feeds.

Reciprocity went down under the blow of the manufacturers and the thrusters of the transportation companies. It would appear that the consumers in Canada have no rights apart from the wishes of the "interests," and we may make up our minds that the government in power, the election won, will resort to lotus beds of voluptuous idleness, to revel in the luxurious dreams of the rich man's opiate through whose glamor the stern realities that are, are not, and the universal content that is not, is, while the express companies are given a free hand to work the bunko game upon us ordinary citizens. Canada needs an effective parcel post system. When shall we get it?

**MORE STRINGENT REGULATIONS FOR CARRYING OF FIRE ARMS**

**ATTORNEY GENERAL BOWSER INTRODUCES BILL PROVIDING SEVERE PENALTIES FOR ILLEGAL CARRYING AND SALE OF OFFENSIVE WEAPONS**

Victoria, Feb. 8.—One of the most important pieces of legislation introduced during the present session of the Provincial House is Attorney General Bowser's bill for more stringent regulation of the carrying and sale of firearms and other offensive weapons. The substance of the bill is as follows:

"Every person who exposes for sale, offers for sale or sells any howie knife, dirk, dagger, stiletto, metal knuckles, skull cracker or slingshot, or who sells a revolver, pistol or airgun, to any person other than one holding a certificate issued under section 118 of the Criminal Code, or one, being over 16 years of age, who produces to and leaves with the vendor a permit in writing, signed by the superintendent of Provincial Police, or a chief constable or chief of police of a city or district municipality, allowing him to purchase a revolver, pistol or airgun, shall be guilty of an offence, and liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$200 or less than \$25, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months, with or without hard labor, or to both; and the bowie knife, dirk, dagger, stiletto, metal knuckles, skull cracker or slingshot, revolver, pistol or airgun so exposed or offered for sale or sold by such person shall be confiscated by the police magistrate or justice and transferred to the superintendent of Provincial Police, chief constable or chief of police aforesaid, or destroyed as such magistrate or justice may see fit.

"(1) Every person who sells a revolver, pistol or airgun under the provisions of section 2 hereof, without keeping a record of the date of the sale, name of maker, serial number of such revolver, pistol or airgun and the name, address and occupation of the purchaser, or who sells or exposes or offers for sale any revolver or pistol which does not bear a serial number and the maker's name shall be guilty of an offence and liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty not exceeding \$200 or less than \$25, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months, with or without hard labor, or to both; and the revolver, pistol or airgun so exposed or offered for sale or sold by such person shall be confiscated by the police magistrate or justice and transferred to the superintendent of Provincial Police, chief constable or chief of police aforesaid, or destroyed as such magistrate or justice may see fit. (2) The record referred to in sub-section 1 may be inspected at any time by any peace officer, and a copy thereof shall be transmitted by the person making the sale to the superintendent of Provincial Police within seven days after the 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December in each year. A violation of this sub-section shall render the offender liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty not exceeding \$50.

"Every peace officer may search any person who he has reason to believe and does believe is violating any of the provisions of sections 115, 116, 117, 118, 119, 120, 121, 123, 124, 126 and 127 of the Criminal Code, and may seize any of the weapons which such person is illegally carrying, and any such weapon seized under this section shall be

confiscated and handed over to the superintendent of Provincial Police or to the chief constable or chief of police aforesaid, to be by him retained, disposed of or destroyed as he may see fit.

"If any of the weapons mentioned in the second section hereof is found upon a person believed not to be a native of Canada by the constable making the search or by the justice of the peace or magistrate before whom such person is charged with an offence, he shall report such facts to the Attorney General, and the Attorney General may communicate with the Minister of the Interior with the view of having such person deported under the Immigration Act.

"The Lieutenant Governor in council may make such regulations as shall be deemed necessary or convenient for carrying into effect the provisions of this act.

This act shall come into force on the first day of September, 1913."

**GERMANS WANT A LARGER ARMY**

**Smaller Towns Though Heavily Burdened are Willing to Make Great Financial Sacrifices**

Berlin, Feb. 8.—A resolution regretting the hesitation of German army authorities in introducing an "army bill on a grand scale corresponding to the gravity of the present time," was unanimously adopted by the executive committee of the Imperial League of German Towns, which is composed of representatives of towns with less than 25,000 population. The resolution further declares that the "smaller" towns of Germany, although already heavily burdened, are willing to make great financial sacrifices in order to render the fatherland able to throw its sword into the scale in favor of European peace.
