#### DRIVING TEST BACKFIRES --REACTIONS UP AFTER DRINK

LONDON M—A television program backfired Tuesday night when three motorists did better after drinking whisky than they did while dry. The three Britons—two men and a girl—volunteered to help a BBC safety program—How Good a Driver Are You?—prove that alcohol slows a driver's reac-

The test consisted of negotiating an automobile over a set course, with a lot of reversing, turning and going forward and without knocking down or touching a series of posts. The first driver swung sober through the course in 45.5 seconds. Then he drank two whiskies and made it in 42 seconds. The girl, a 21-year-old secretary, took 44 seconds before the drinks and 38.5 after. The third driver's times: Before 43.5; after 38.

Prof. Robert Drew of University College hastened to explain that "the second test was taken before the alcohol really had time to get into the bloodstream."




