of certain litigation for an accounting, to the effect that he had paid \$41,000 of the company's money to get business from the government aggregating \$117,000. A number of officers of the company examined last session failed to clear up the matter, though they absolved the politicians and government employees.

On Friday last the missing witness, Miller, appeared before the public accounts committee and in examination by Mr. Meighen reiterated that the amount in question had been paid to get the contracts.

When asked to whom it had been paid, the witness refused to answer on the ground that it would prejudice pending legislation. Mr. Meighen at once moved that the refusal be reported to the House. After some discussion, Mr. Miller was allowed to make a statement.

"In addition to the fact that my answer would prejudice the case now in the courts," he said, "my refusal is due to the fact that I never paid a dollar to any senator or any member of Parliament or official of the government. I think it is a private affair."

The case occupied the entire sitting of the House from 3 p. m. until midnight.
