CANADIANS AFFECTED BY MEXICAN REVOLT

Five Companies Whose Combined Capital Exceeds \$120,000,000.

Montreal, Feb. 23.—How vitally Canada is concerned in the present Mexican revolution may be realized from the fact that Canadians are interested in enterprises operating in the agitated republic whose combined capital exceeds the sum of \$120,000,000.

The whole of this amount has not been furnished by Canadians, but investors of the Dominion have subscribed a generous part of it, and are represented on the boards of the several companies detailed below, all of which are incorporated under the federal laws of Canada.

- Mexican Northwestern Railway—Capital issued, \$25,000,000; bonds, \$15,000,000. Mexican Northern Power Company—Capital issued, \$12,600,000; bonds, \$10,000,000. Mexican Tramways Company—Capital issued, \$16,487,400; bonds, \$15,000,000. Mexican Light and Power

Company—Capital issued, \$13,585,000; bonds, \$6,000,000. Mexican Mahogany Company—Capital issued, \$1,000,000; bonds, \$600,000.

VANCOUVER'S REVENUE OVER FOUR MILLIONS

Nearly a Million Increase Over the Previous Year—Water-Works Shows Big Surplus

Vancouver, Feb. 24.—For the first time in Vancouver's history the total revenue topped the four million dollar mark in 1912, the correct figure being \$4,008,762.30, as against \$3,013,930.30 in 1911, and only \$1,280,646.24 five years ago.

General revenue accounted for \$3,492,502.39 of this huge income, and the waterworks contributed \$516,259.91. That a commendable astuteness has been displayed in the year's figuring by City Accountant A. J. Pilkington is evidenced by the fact that there is a surplus over general revenue of \$12,589.89, and in the waterworks revenue of \$153,133.62.
