**GRAND TRUNK B. C. COAL CO. HAVE COAL MINES WITHIN
SIXTEEN MILES OF NEW HAZELTON — DEVELOPMENT TO START SOON**

Judging from the following which appeared in the last issue of the *Omineca Herald*, Prince Rupert will not always be at the mercy of the coal operators of Vancouver Island. It seems possible that before another winter has passed by residents of this city may be getting their supply of coal from mines in the interior. The Herald says:

The fuel situation in this district and all along the line of the G.T.P. is about to undergo a radical change which will be of considerable benefit to the people of the district. The Herald has learned from the general manager of the Grand Trunk B. C. Coal Co., Ltd., that it is the intention of the company to begin the development of their coal lands just as soon as the weather will permit, and to ship the coal as fast as they can get it out.

The coal lands of the Grand Trunk B. C. Coal Co., Ltd., are situated at about Twenty Mile, or about sixteen miles from Hazelton. They have twelve sections alongside the G.T.P. railway or within a very short distance of the tracks. As a shipping proposition it is ideal, and there is every reason to believe that coal will be very largely burned in New Hazelton next winter. The coal has been reported upon by coal experts as being of high grade.

The annual meeting of the company was held recently in Vancouver, when about a hundred shareholders, together with the directors, were present. The reports presented were all of an encouraging nature and all the shareholders were enthusiastic. James Wright, Vancouver, was re-elected managing director.
