tempted to reorganize the financial system immediately, he is being gradually dissuaded from recommending it.

It is possible, however, that he may suggest, in his special message, the framing of a bill during recess in order that it may be ready for immediate consideration when Congress meets in regular session.

Chairman Underwood has told the President of the probability of insolvency in the House on the tariff question and of a scheme he has devised to bring the insurgents into line. This consists of deferring the appointments of all committees, other than the Ways and Means and Rules and Mileage, until the House has finished its tariff revision, in order that those who may be tempted to "insurge" will realize that undue activity in opposition to the Democratic leaders will affect their chances of securing desirable committee assignments.

OLD LEAGUE WILL STICK TOGETHER

National Lacrosse Union Clubs Will Not Enter Any Other League

Montreal, March 17.—To remain banded together as the National Lacrosse Union was the decision of the delegates representing the four affiliated clubs of the original governing board at a meeting held in Montreal.

Following a meeting held early last week at the request of the club, President Murphy sent out notices calling the gathering to discuss the lacrosse situation and decide on some course of action for the coming season. The interests of the game were discussed from almost every angle and while it was the unanimous opinion of the delegates that amalgamation with the Dominion Lacrosse Union or a reorganization with one or the other of the two bodies would be in the best interests of the national game, they decided to go on as they were.

For the past few weeks rumor after rumor was sent broadcast that there would be a joining of the two unions or a new league formed which would be composed of six clubs. Although there has been one or two meetings of the representatives from both unions they were purely informal and nothing was done in the matter. The representatives of the four clubs are as enthusiastic over the decision as in the palmy days of lacrosse and are confident that the game can be placed back at the standard at which it dropped.
