FIGHTING AN ENEMY TWICE HIS STRENGTH

Mexican Federal General Batling for Supremacy of Northern Sonora

Navo, Arizona, March 19-Phone 116 General Ojeda, with a force of 475 federals, is fighting an enemy twice his strength this afternoon in what may prove to be the decisive battle for supremacy in Northern Sonora. Bot. tled up at Naco by constitutionalists advancing from the east, west and south, the commander of Huerta's army unexpectedly left his fortifications and marched two miles southeast to meet the columns of Elias Calles and Prefecto Bracmonte. A brisk-ngagement began at once, the federals using field artillery with effect. By 1 o'clock the fighting was general between the 500 fe. derals and 900 state troops. The constitutionalists were begin ning to hold their positions despite the artillery fire.
