

## Home charges Soviet Union with deception

UNITED NATIONS. (AP) — Britain called on the Soviet Union today to seek an "honorable deal" with the Western powers Berlin, disarmament and other critical problems threatening to throw, a nuclear cloud over the

British Foreign Secretary Lord, Home told the United Nations General Assembly in a policy speech that the Russians are playing with nuclear fire by trying "to set man against his neighbors."

## REQUEST TO GRANT INDIANS FULL LIQUOR RIGHTS DENIED

VICTORIA (P) \_\_\_.Attorney-General Bonner said Monday he has again tried unsuccessfully to get the federal government to concede full liquor rights for British Columbia

His latest request, in a letter to Citizenship Minister Fairclough July 19, brought a negative response, said Mr. Bonner. This time he had asked for complete exemption of all B.C. Indians from liquor restrictions under the Indian Act.

It followed a motion of the B.C. legislature last winter calling for federal action to untangle a legally complicated situation in the province B.C. Indians from more than 1,000 different bands are

scattered throughout the province in only some 200 reserves. The federal Indian Act allows them to have liquor rights if a plebiscite is held by bands. This just won't work in B.C., said Mr., Bonner, because Indians from one band might be in a dozen or more reserves. We want no discriniination at all in B.C." said Mr.

He said all Indians should be allowed to purchase liquor in government liquor stores and to drink it in public outlets as well as at home.


